ST. LUCIA ISLAND TOUR IN DEPTH



TOAILLE WATERFALL

If you're looking for an easy-to-access waterfall with photo-worthy views, head to Toraille Waterfall. One of St. Lucia's most popular falls, Toraille is located just outside of Soufriere. The waterfall stands 50 feet tall and features a swimmable watering hole at the bottom, where travelers can pose for a quick picture or video.



DIAMOND FALLS BOTANICAL GARDENS

If you're tired of lounging on the beach but not up for a hike through The Pitons, then whiling away a few hours at Diamond Falls Botanical Gardens & Mineral Baths is sure to be a relaxing – and eye-catching – compromise. This 6-acre attraction is filled to the brim with vibrant foliage, including hibiscus, ixora and heliconia, to name a few. The Diamond Waterfall is also a feast for the eyes, changing colors throughout the year due to the mixture of rainwater and volcanic minerals that flows down the falls. You can also take a relaxing dip in the on-site mineral baths.



PITONS

Some islands in the Caribbean are flat, formed from coral reefs or limestone plateaus atop bedrock. St. Lucia, though, is volcanic, formed between 5 and 6 million years ago. Its famous twin peaks, Petit Piton and Gros Piton, are babies in comparison, formed between 200,000 and 300,000 years ago.

ST. LUCIA

A spellbinding otherness sets St. Lucia apart from its Caribbean cousins. The twin spires of the Pitons rise dramatically from the sea like ancient island stewards, granting passage to hot springs, waterfalls, and beaches. A honeymooner's paradise with some of the finest luxury resorts and sunset vistas in all of the West Indies, this remarkable island is also a great hiking destination, a scuba and snorkeling hotspot, and an excellent place to try island cuisine.



MARIGOT BAY

Recognized as one of the Caribbean's most secure anchoring spots, Marigot Bay provides protection to ships during the roughest of seas. The bay is known as a "hurricane hole" due to its location on the west side of the island, where it is surrounded by mountains and experiences minimal tidal changes.



CASTRIES CITY VIEW POINT

Perched above the bustling capital of St. Lucia, Castries City View Point is a gem that beckons tourists with its breathtaking panoramic views. This popular tourist attraction provides an ideal vantage point to admire the vibrant cityscape, the sparkling Caribbean Sea, and the lush surrounding hills. Visitors often find themselves captivated by the sight of colorful buildings, the bustling harbor, and the distant mountains, all framed by the stunning blue sky. Whether you're a photography enthusiast or just looking to immerse yourself in the natural beauty of St. Lucia, this viewpoint promises a memorable experience.

SULPHUR SPRINGS

Sulphur Springs is billed as having the Caribbean's "only drive-in volcano," meaning that visitors are able to safely drive right by an active volcano. Located in the western town of Soufrière, the volcano emits sulfuric steam rather than lava, so remember to hold your nose to protect yourself from the overpowering rotten egg smell. The attraction also features warm sulfuric pools that visitors can bathe in.



ATV

Let us take you back in time on our powerful, all-terrain ATV! Rev your engines as we pass through a large historical estate, once home to one of Saint Lucia's largest banana plantations. Tune in as we take a deep delve into the rich history of the island including how the locals use the beloved banana plant. Take the dirt path and be amazed at scenic St. Lucia from one of the most popular view points on the island, Debarra's View Point, over looking the Atlantic coast and Grande Anse Beach. Go off road and revel in an adventure you won't soon forget!

DOMINICA

Dominica is a very mountainous and rugged island with 9 semi-active volcanos, natural hot springs, tropical rainforests, too many gorgeous waterfalls to count, and a river for every day of the year (over 365). There are spectacular and panoramic vistas around every bend.



TI KWEN GLO CHO HOT SPRINGS

Experience a trekking journey through the hills and valleys of Dominica's untouched forests. Hike through thick rain forest up hills to elfin forests and into the other-worldly Valley of Desolation. Navigate through hot rocks and steaming pools of boiling mud. Cook eggs in thermal crevices and get a beauty mask from nature. Experience the awe of one of the world's largest boiling lakes. Immerse into warm sulphur pools carved by Mother Nature and take a refreshing swim up the emerald canyon of Titou Gorge. End off the day with a therapeutic dip at Ti Kwen Glo Cho's hot pools.



MORNE BRUCE

Perched atop the scenic hills overlooking the vibrant capital of Roseau, Morne Bruce stands as a majestic sentinel, offering panoramic views and a tranquil escape from the hustle and bustle of city life. As you ascend the winding road to Morne Bruce, the lush greenery of the surrounding rain-forest unfolds before you, hinting at the natural beauty that awaits at the summit. Upon reaching the lookout point, you'll be greeted by breathtaking vistas of Roseau's colorful rooftops, the sparkling Caribbean Sea, and the verdant valleys beyond—a sight that will leave you mesmerized.

TITOU GORGE

Translated to “little hole”, Titou Gorge is an enchanting swimming hole, nestled in the beautiful, mountain-top community of Laudat. The gorge is known for its refreshing emerald water, which flows calmly down mountain creeks. Rock towers above the river connecting with blue sky and green canopy. Golden sun pierces through almost spotlighting swimmers up this enchanting beauty. Titou is best known for its iconic scene in *Pirates of the Caribbean*, where Captain Jack Sparrow is seen tumbling down the gorge in a vine cage. A swim up the canyon reveals a clam, emerald oasis, serenaded by chirping birds and rustling trees. A small waterfall awaits the more adventurous swimmer and rock crevices make the perfect jumping boards.



TRAFALGAR FALLS

Dominica is known for its numerous cascading waterfalls, all unique and magnificent in their own right but Trafalgar Falls is indeed remarkable. The only twin waterfall on the island, these majestic beauties cascade side by side into pristine pools beneath. Affectionately named the Mother and Father Falls, Trafalgar's twin falls complement each other beautifully and give birth to numerous water basins and streams at their base. Trafalgar is also known for its unique sulphur springs which pool warm water alongside cold- a perfect, natural therapeutic bath. Trafalgar Falls is another must see for visitors to the island, and it is worth experiencing the magical warm and cold water that define the uniqueness of this natural wonder.
